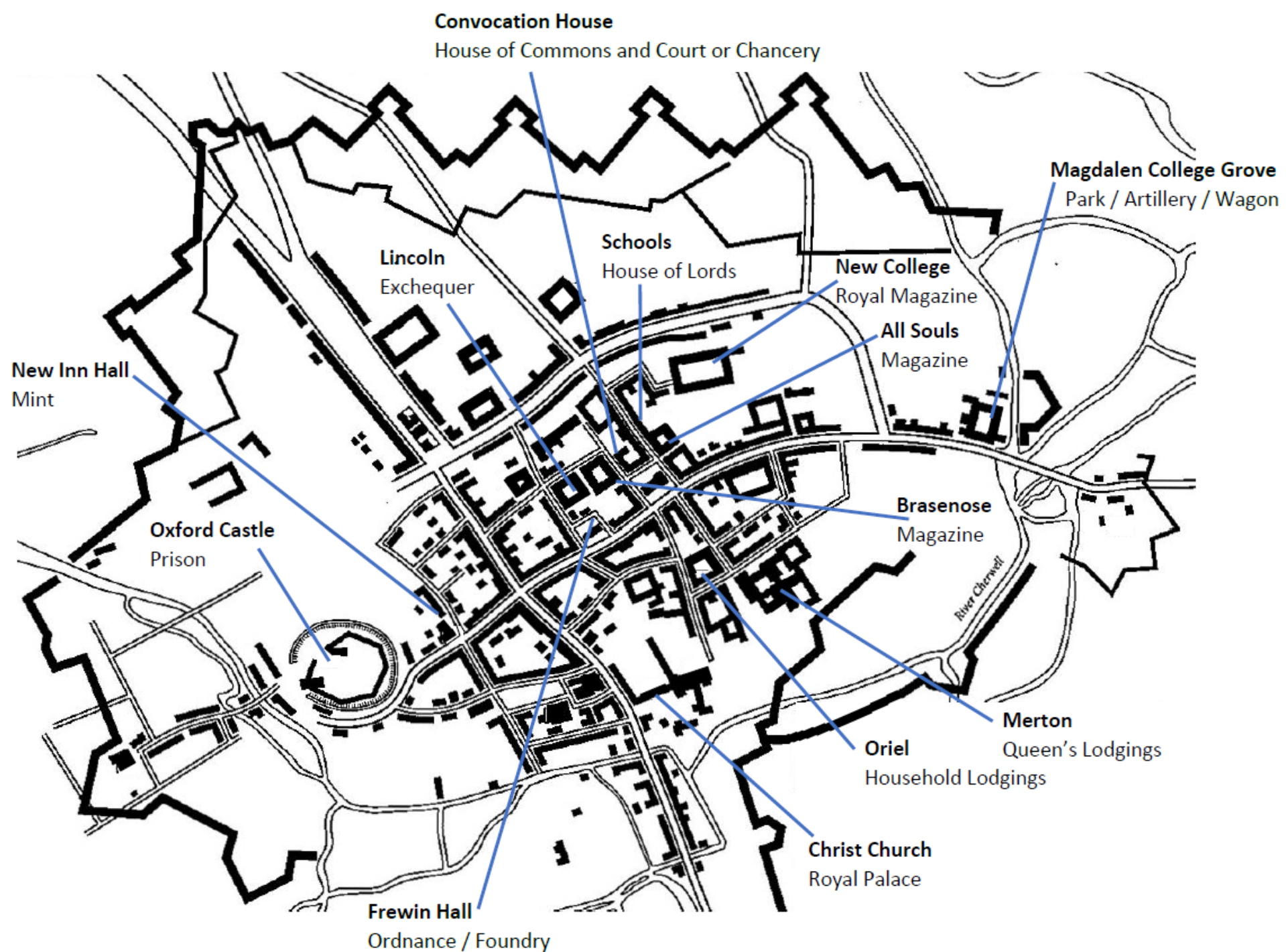

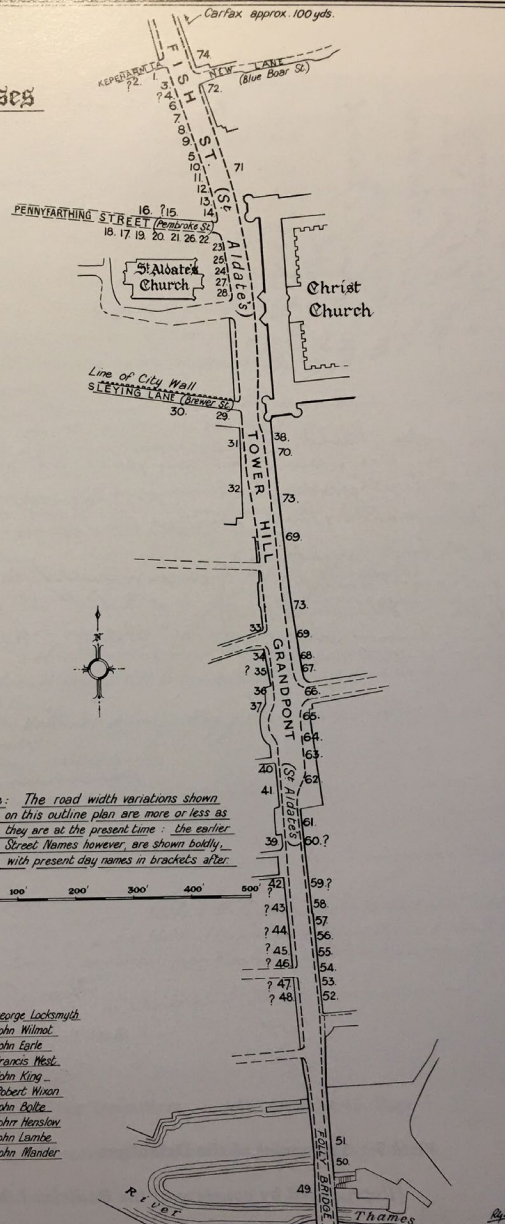
Plan of St Aldate's Houses 1643 ~ 44.

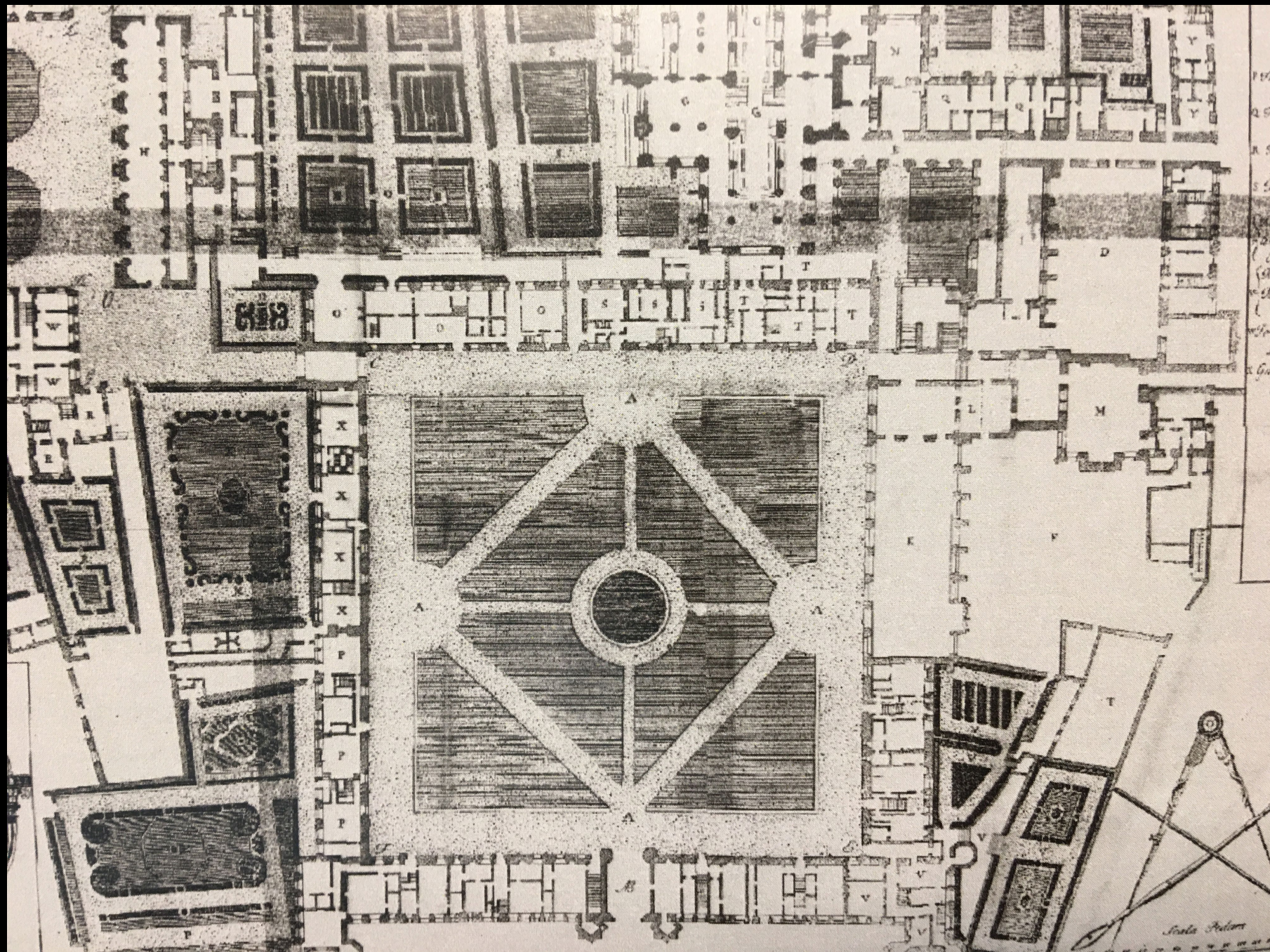

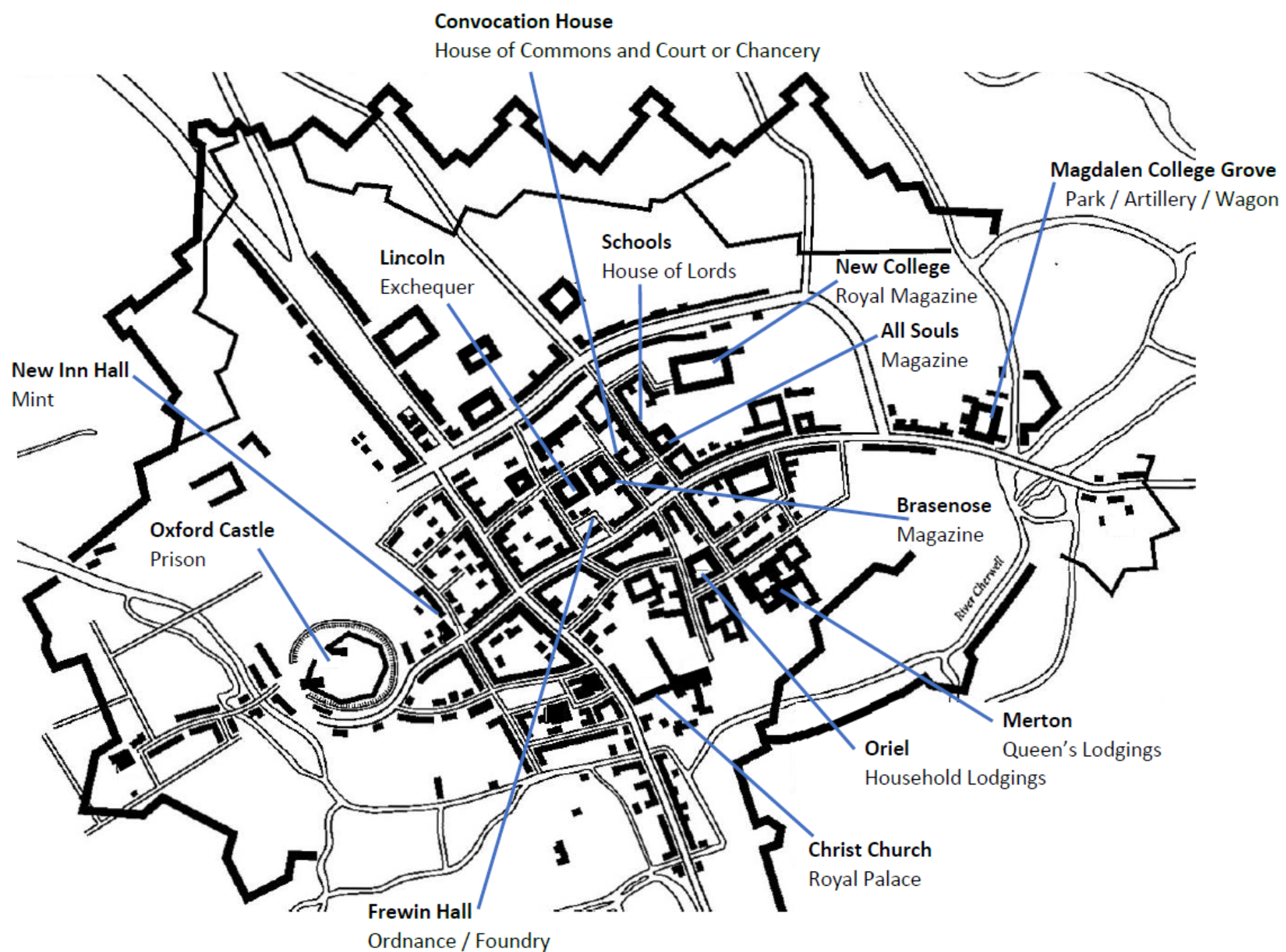








Portrait by William Dobson (1611–46) painted in Oxford during the Civil War:

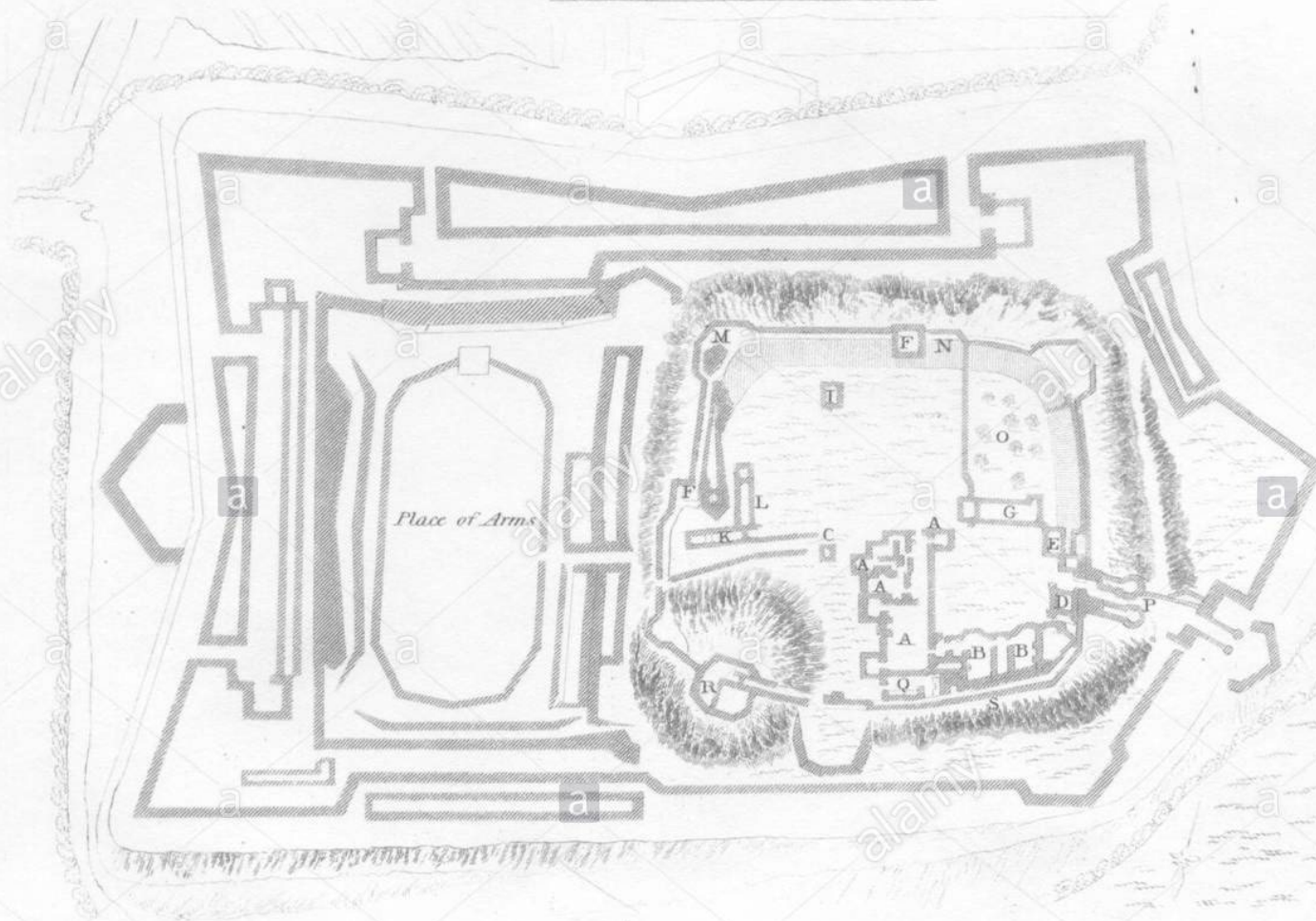

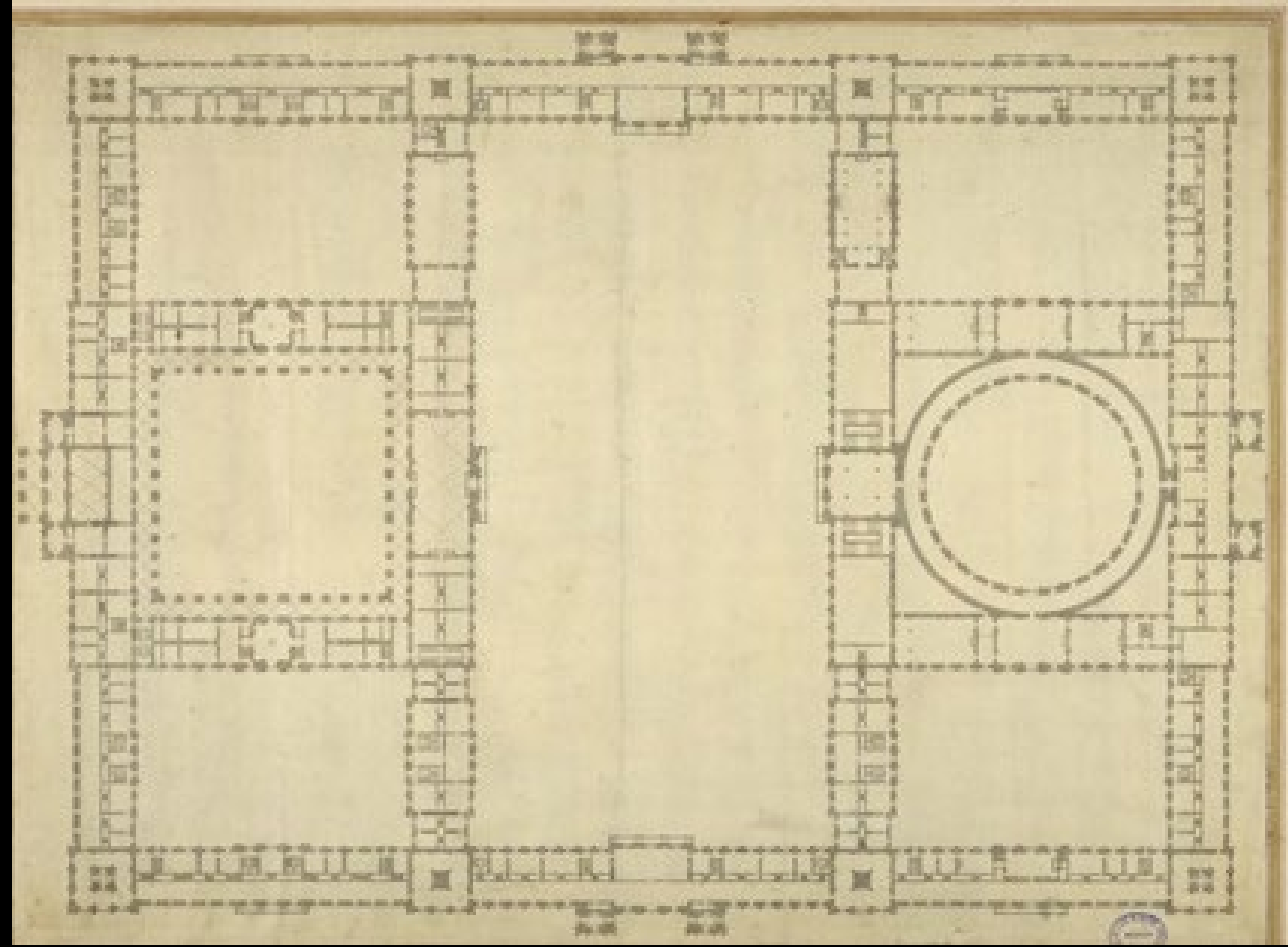

DECLARATION FOR PEACE

From the Kings most Excellent Majesty, and the Dukes, Mar-
queses, Bishops, Earles, Lords, Knights, and the rest of His Commissioners
at Newport; to be published throughout the Kingdom of England, and
Dominion of Wales; Containing, their unanimous Resolutions for an
Agreement with both Houses of Parliament, within the time (of 40 dayes)
limited for the Treaty; And His Gracious and Finall Answer to the paper
of Ireland, presented to the Commissioners on Friday last, With their happy
and joyfull Agreement therein.

Dated at Newport 14 October 1648. Subscribed CHARLES REX.

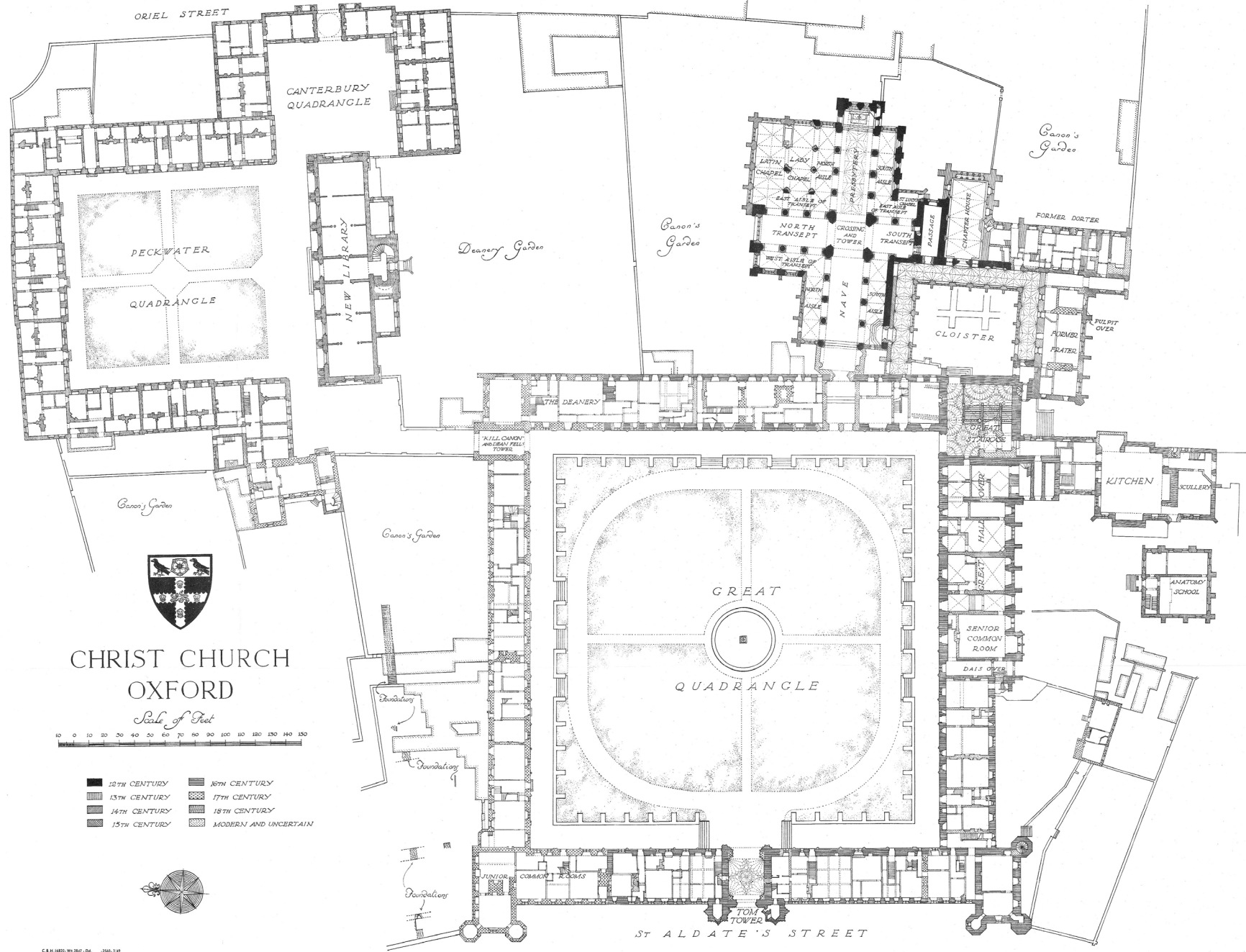

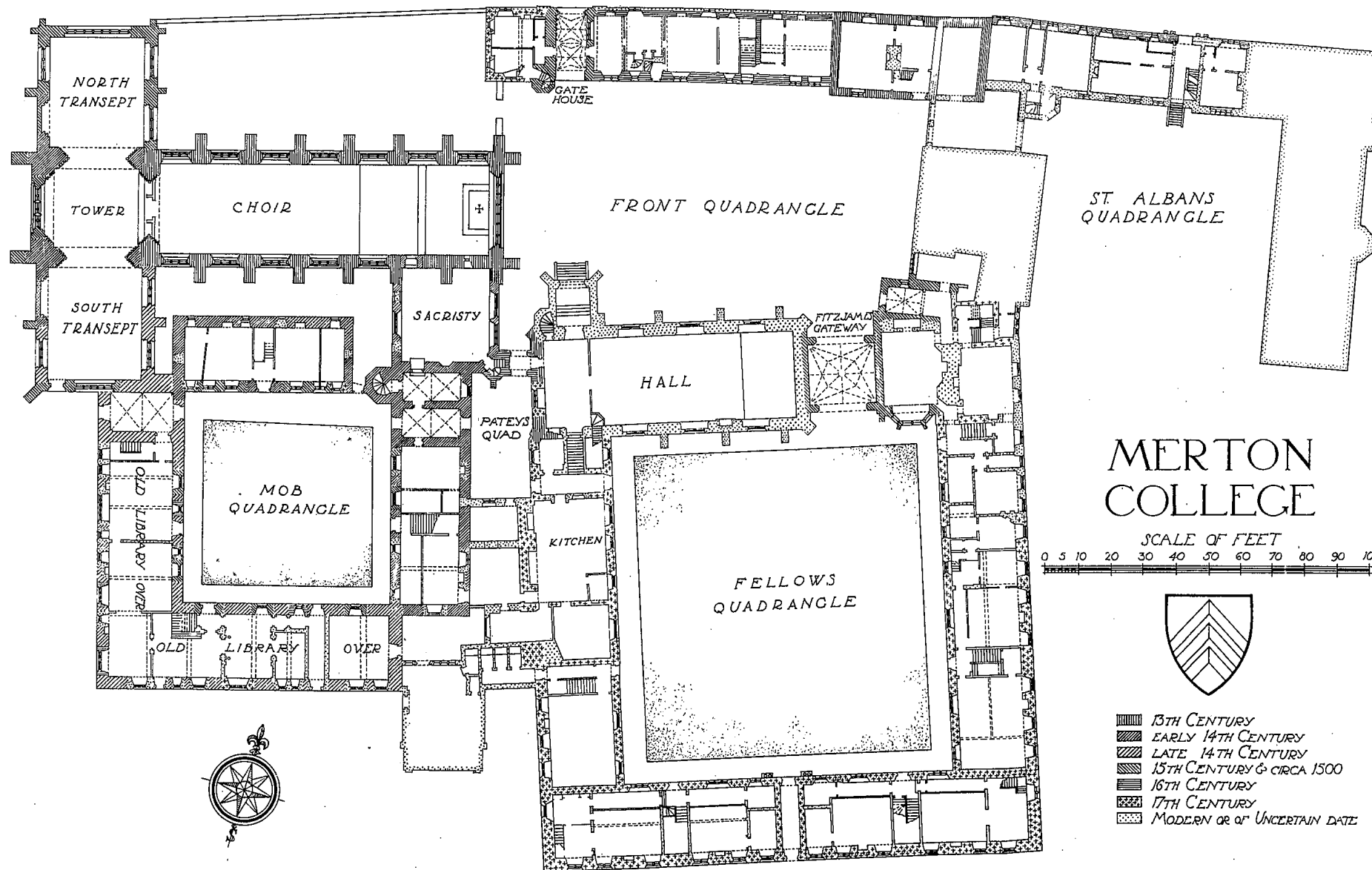

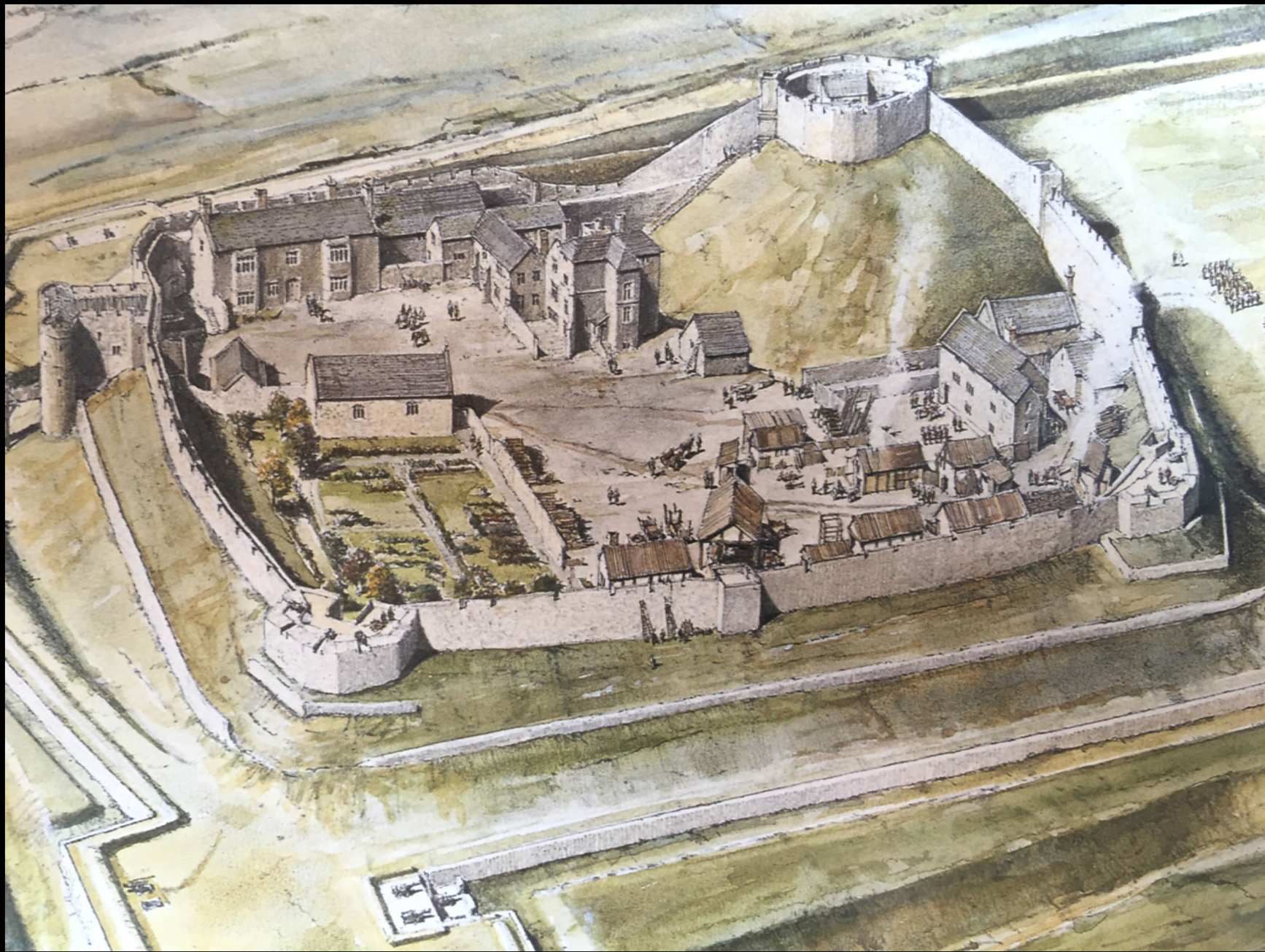
